9. President's Report

Kirk read the highlights of his report. The complete report was sent with the meeting invite and is included below:

Welcome friends,

June 3rd the 917 and 951 committee for the Supplemental fund meet to review all the applications that have come in since the announcement at the April general meeting. As of June 21 we have forwarded the successful applicants accounting for payment.

On June 4 HR meet with both Vice Presidents and myself to discuss the employer's response to the meeting we held on March 19th on the Union time off LOA. The outcome of that meeting lead to a new LOA that has the Chief Stewards position extended till Dec 31, 2021. The LOA also has the parties meeting again on Nov 12 to discuss what steps will be taken prior to end of this agreement. Stay tuned. June 8 & 10 Myself with Ted Godwin and Heidi Loveridge attended the 39th Lancaster Labour and Policy conference, this included major case law and legislative updates, employer rules and employee rights in a pandemic, practical advice on obtaining health information.

June 16-18 I attended the Canadian Labour Congress convention online, some highlight: all the CUPE endorsed candidates for new leadership were elected. New President Bea Bruske, Sec Treasure Lily Chang, Executive Vice Presidents Larry Rousseau, Siobhan Vipond, Indigenous workers Gloria Lepine, LGBTQ2SI workers Gina McKay, Alt Sussanne Skidmore. Young workers: Deena Kapacila, Labour Council Vice President Pacific Region: Darlene Rotchford.

There was a per capita increase resolution that passed, this will be covered by CUPE National, and we will not see any increase on our end. Another resolution that passed deleted language that made it not possible

to run for election if you were older than 65. Others included Pharmacare and Health Care, Women's economic justice, Anti-Scab Legislation, protecting and expanding Canada Post, Oppose Conservative Governments, and support for the NDP.

Emergency resolutions: Honouring the 215 Kamloops residential victims and implementation the 94 TRC calls to action; Stop Anti-Asian hate and violence; and Stop Islamophobia hate and violence.

On June 19 I attended the Miner's Memorial in Cumberland and laid a bouquet of flowers on behalf of the local and the Victoria Labour Council.

One dispute under the Expedited Dispute Resolution Process for Accommodation issues has a meeting date set with the Arbitrator early in July. The matter is related to accommodation and COVID and it appears that the strategy from the employer is to simply wait out the pandemic rather than accommodate our member.

One regular layoff happened this month with a reorganization in a department. That member was presented with a vacant position and placed within 72 hours.

Currently we have 5 outstanding grievances.

The Pandemic hasn't seemed to have an effect on grievances. It's actually been easier to schedule a zoom meeting with Human Resources.

The last meeting was held June 8th

The Global pandemic has impacted claim behavior and usage. Many service providers closed during the early months of the pandemic and treatments were deferred. By the end of 2020 claims were returning to normal levels and it is likely 2021 will likely see higher levels of claims as members catch up on their treatments.

Extended Health Plan

- Annual surplus after 4 years of deficit
- Cumulative deficit reduced by half
- Claims reduced by 12.6% in 2020
- No adjustment to premium rates recommended for 2021

Dental Plan

- Annual surplus after 4 years annual deficit
- Cumulative surplus due to the 21% reduction in claims
- No adjustment to premium rates recommended for 2021

Increase in Long Term Disability claims but many are identified as likely to return to work.

Morneau Shepell has been rebranded to LifeWorks.

Decrease in the numbers of staff, faculty, and families accessing EFAP. Participation in online sessions is robust.

July 1st rollout of LifeWorks on-line total wellbeing platform.

September 30th - National Truth and Reconciliation Day

A bill creating a national holiday to commemorate the tragic history and lasting effects of Canada's residential school system, and to honour Indigenous survivors and their families and communities, received royal assent June 3 after passing unanimously in the Senate.

The National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, a new statutory holiday for employees in federally regulated workplaces, will be observed Sept. 30.

This date coincides with Orange Shirt Day, which began in 2013 and involves wearing orange shirts to honour Indigenous children forced to leave their families to attend residential schools.

The orange shirt came to symbolize the experiences and abuse suffered by children at residential schools after Phyllis Webstad, a member of the Stswecem'c Xgat'tem First Nation, shared her story of her first day going to school on the Dog Creek reserve in British Columbia.

Phyllis's grandmother had given her a new orange shirt with laces to wear on her first day; when she arrived at the school, all of Phyllis's clothes were taken and never returned.

"The colour orange has always reminded me of that and how my feelings didn't matter, how no one cared and how I felt like I was worth nothing," Phyllis writes on the Orange Shirt Day website. "All of us little children were crying and no one cared."

Wearing an orange shirt on Sept. 30 has become a way for Canadians to show that *Every Child Matters*, the slogan adopted by the Orange Shirt Day organization.

Establishing a national holiday was one of the 94 recommendations from the Truth and Reconciliation Commission. It is anticipated the holiday will be accompanied by educational campaigns similar to Remembrance Day.
