Polytechnique's desire to honour the victims of this massacre remains strong. By commemorating this painful event, we also highlight the courage, solidarity, and dedication to equity that the Polytechnique community continues to express. The triumphs and successes of our communities are the sincerest ways to honour the 14 women whose lives and dreams were dramatically and unjustly cut short.

# 13. President's Report - KM

Welcome friends,

On Dec 7, I met with post-secondary Unions on Vancouver Island on common concerns about funding and COVID related matters. Layoffs and modified appointments are troubling news coming for some institutions as well as deficits caused over the last 20 months. Recruitment and retention issues are happening at most campuses.

After our vice presidents met with Human Resources on Nov 15 over the letter of agreement for Union time off that has been in place for 20 years and concerns about the funding from the employer. The Union made an offer to help alleviate the financial cost until June 30, 2022 to provide unencumbered stability in good faith. The employer rejected this offer and as a result the Chief Steward will be retuning to their home department January 3,2022. This will result in the department no longer receiving any finical support from the Union or the University. I will assure you that the Chief Steward will operate in the same capacity as before with the ability to meet with members in our union office. We will be extra vigilant to ensure no discrimination or harassment, becomes the Chief Steward with this return to the Library.

On a positive note the past 20 months have brought us closer with the other Unions on campus and the Island in post-secondary, building a new solidarity network, that I hope will continue. We were able to coordinate with the Faculty and PEA when it came to asking the University to deal with our concerns over how they would handle COVID-19 (delta variant) in the fall.

As 2021 winds up, I wish to thank our stewards and executive who have helped guide our local through this past year, as I have said before when we all work together we are at our best.

I wish all of you a happy, and most importantly, a safe, holiday season! And hope to see you in person in the New Year.

- a. Report from CUPE 951 Delegates to CUPE National Convention 2021
  - i. Pat Shade
    - Pat thanked the local for nominating him for the CUPE National Disability Activist Award, which he won: <a href="Pat Shade: Fighting for more inclusion and accessibility">Pat Shade: Fighting for more inclusion and accessibility</a> <a href="Pat Shade: Cupe.ca">Canadian Union of Public Employees (cupe.ca)</a>; the award was presented to Pat by the CUPE National President, Mark Hancock. #### ii. Page DeWolfe

• Page reported that the speaking times were very limited and there wasn't much of a chance to get to the mics and speak; she regrets that she didn't get a chance to speak to

some of the resolutions that she would have like to; there were many important resolutions that got debated and approved. Page thanked the local for sending her to the convention.

#### iii. Laurie Whyte

• Laurie was happy to report that the very first resolution to come to the floor of convention was one that Vancouver Island and Local 951 submitted – and it passed! It was originally written by own very own member, Kara White for the CUPE BC Convention in 2019 and was tweaked to be appropriate for the CUPE National Convention; it is asking for CUPE National to develop and provide mental health care kits for activists; about 3 other resolutions that we submitted also passed; Laurie thanked the local for allowing her to use the diversity credential to attend the convention; Laurie will put the spreadsheet with all the constitutional amendments and resolutions and their outcomes on the CUPE 951 website as soon as she is finished adding the summaries of the resolutions to it; she'll also put the book of resolutions and constitutional amendments on the website so people can read more about them.

#### iv. Amy

• Amy echoed what Page said; she really missed the in-person convention; being virtual really changes things; it's harder and more exhausting when it is virtual; she is grateful that the local sent her; she didn't get up to speak, but hopes to maybe next time.

#### v. Kirk

- CUPE locals, District Councils and Provincial Divisions (CUPE BC) must adopt the CUPE National Code of Conduct
- The Constitutional amendment to add 3 Diversity Vice-President seats failed by a narrow margin of 2%; we needed 63% to pass but only had 61% voted in favor; the delegation from Quebec was opposed at the virtual mic
- Kirk was very proud of our local and Vancouver Island District Council (VIDC) for getting 3 resolutions to the floor, all will go a long way in helping women and others in the labour movement

#### b. Kara White - Staff Pensions Advisory Committee - KM

• The Advisory committee meets a couple times a year with the main meeting in June to preview the information package that members get in early July. There will be a vacancy on this very important committee later in 2022 since I will be stepping down from Advisory Committee duties to take on Investment and Administration duties for our plan. So, the Advisory Committee is looking for any interested member that would like to train and join later in 2022.
